**Paul W. Taylor, Ph. D.** - Center of Digital Government

Paul is the Chief Strategy Officer at the Center for Digital Government. Prior to joining the Center, Dr. Taylor served as the deputy director of the Washington State Department of Information Services (DIS) and the Chief of Staff of the Information Services Board (ISB).

During his tenure as deputy state Chief Information Officer (CIO), Washington was named the nation's original and sustained Digital State for three consecutive years, based on innovations in policy, planning, and practice. Among them, pioneering work in IT Portfolio Management, the award winning enterprise Digital Government Plan, an enterprise Internet-aware security policy, and the creation of a learning environment called *The Academy* where agencies come together to imagine the future...and then build it.

Through decades of work in the public and private sectors, the media and the academy, Dr. Taylor brings a practitioner's perspective to government modernization, technological disruption, cultural production, and public expectations to an open economy. A former Gilder Fellow who was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship in 1994, he is also a member of the adjunct faculty at the Daniel J. Evans School of Public Administration at the University of Washington.

Dr. Taylor is responsible for the national surveys conducted by the Center, which benchmark and measure progress toward best practices in state and local government. He is a contributor to the journal *Public CIO*, the author of a number of book chapters and juried journal articles, and his column – called signal-to-noise – appears each month in *Government Technology* magazine.

Adam, a founding partner of DHM has over 30 years of experience in opinion research. He is a nationally recognized authority on survey research design and an expert focus group moderator. Adam is a frequent speaker at conferences, has been published in national periodicals, and has served as an expert witness. He is known for his work on values and beliefs studies, including the 1992 and 2002 Oregon Values and Beliefs. One of Adam's research specialties is the study of public opinion about government and politics, including e-government. He has conducted surveys and focus groups for local, regional, and state government agencies about their websites and information services.

**Dugan Petty** – *Oregon State, CIO*

Dugan became the Chief Information Officer for Oregon in March of 2007. During his tenure as CIO he has overseen the reorganization of Oregon's information resource management into a new division and led the development the State's Information Resource Management Strategy. He also chairs the National Association of State Chief Information Officers (NASCIO) Greening of IT Committee and is co-chair of NASCIO's Enterprise Architecture Committee. Before becoming the State CIO his duties in the Department of Administrative Services included; overseeing enterprise level procurement, risk management, and serving as the Deputy Administrator for the State Services Division. Dugan has led a number of enterprise level initiatives in Oregon including:

Before coming to Oregon in 1998, Dugan was the Alaska Director of General Service and the State's Chief Procurement Officer, and led an initiative that streamlined procurement practices. In addition, he has served as the chairperson for the Western States Contracting Alliance from 1994 through 1995, and the President of the National Association of State Procurement Officials in 1998. Dugan received the Association's 2004 Guilio Mazzone Distinguished Service Award for his continued service to public purchasing.
