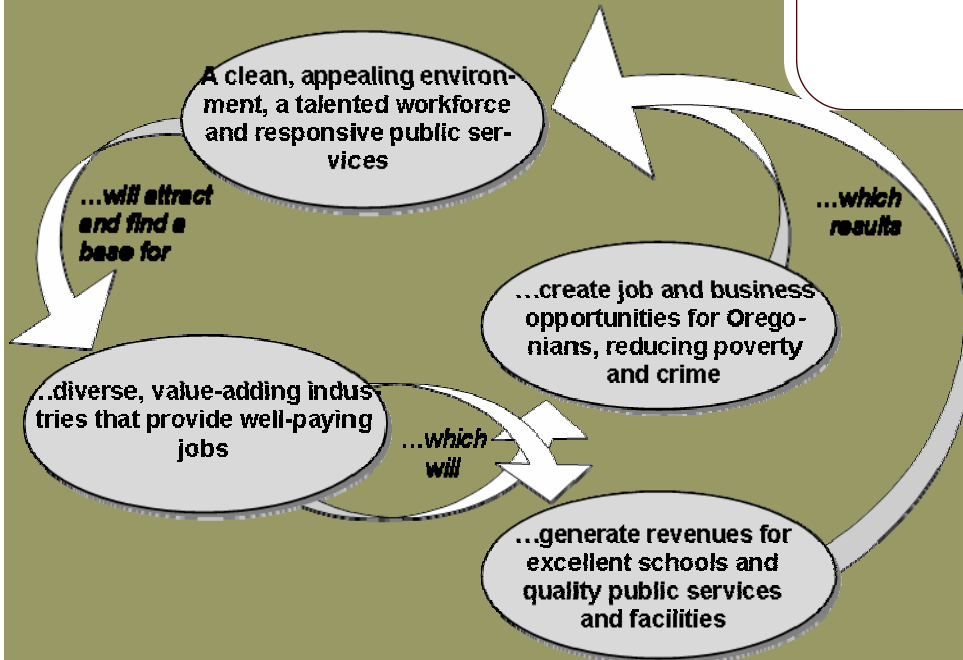

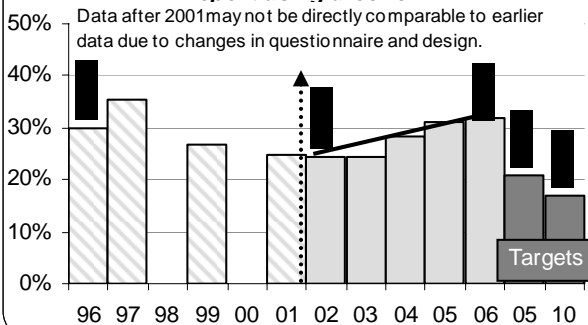
41. Infant mortality rate (per 1,000)



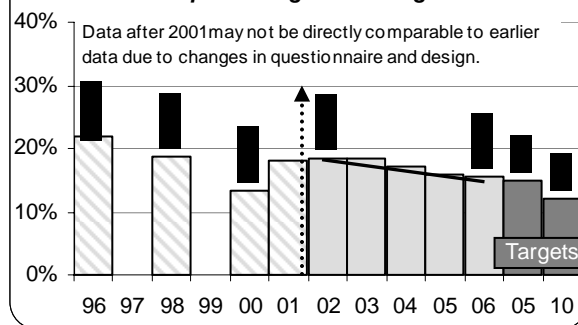
48. Number of child care slots available for every 100 children under age 13



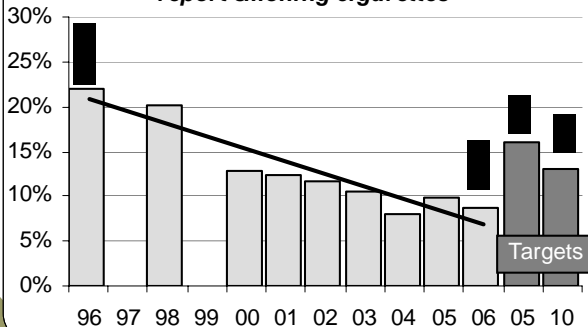
50a. Percent of eighth graders who report using alcohol



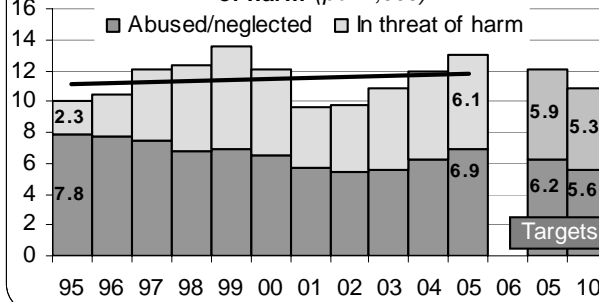
50b. Percent of eighth graders who report using illicit drugs

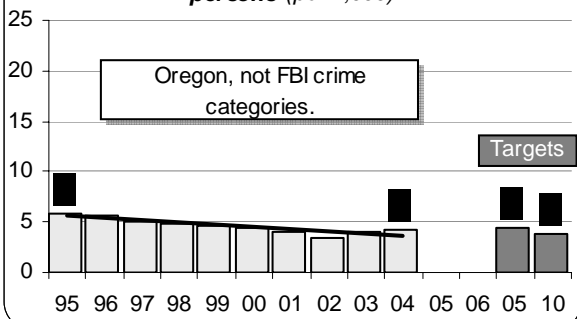
62. Overall reported crimes (per 1,000)



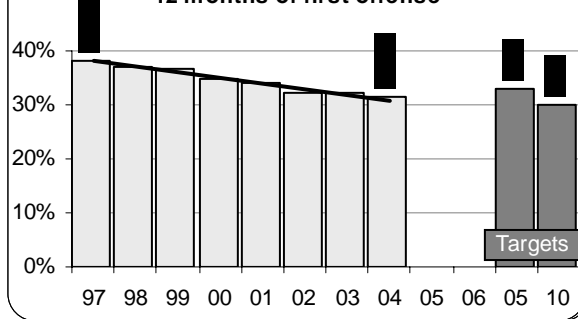
64. Percent of 9-12 students who carry weapons



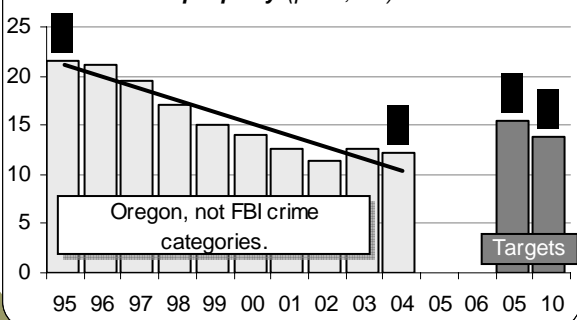
63a. Juvenile arrests for crimes against persons (per 1,000)



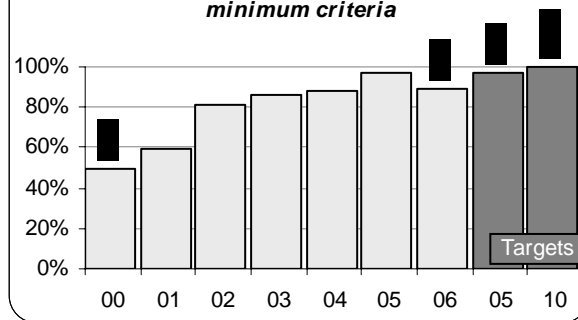
66. New juvenile criminal referral within 12 months of first offense

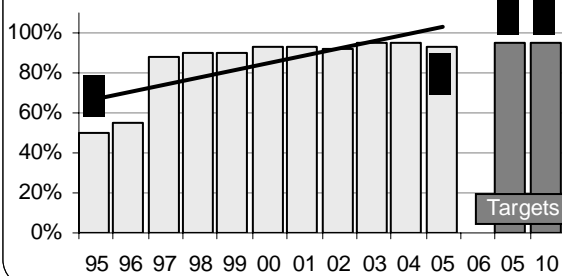

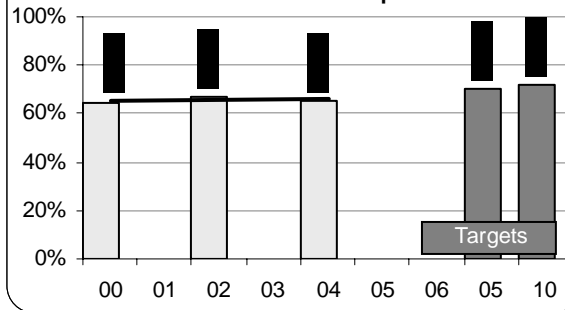

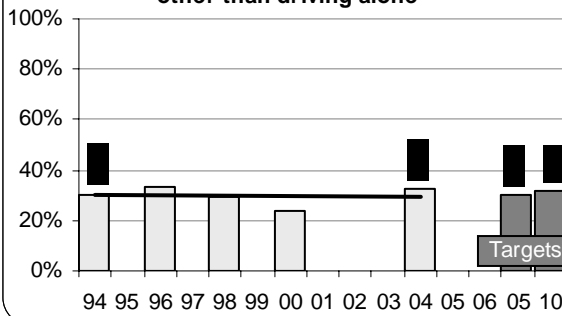
69. Percent of Oregonians drinking water meeting health-based standards



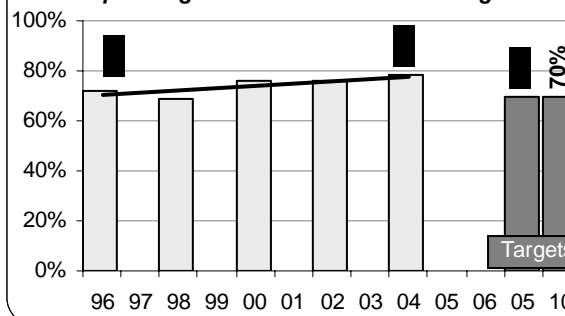
73. Percent of households that are owner occupied



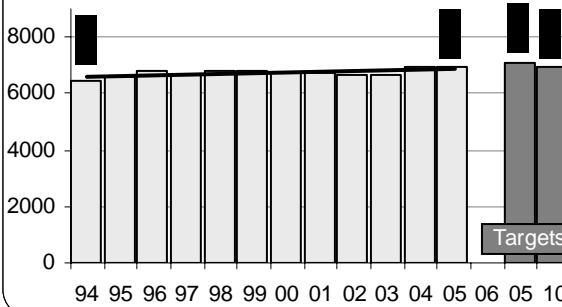
70. Percent commuting by means other than driving alone



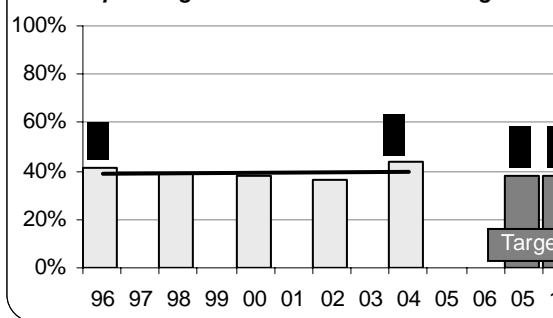
74a. Percent of lower income renters spending >30% of income on housing

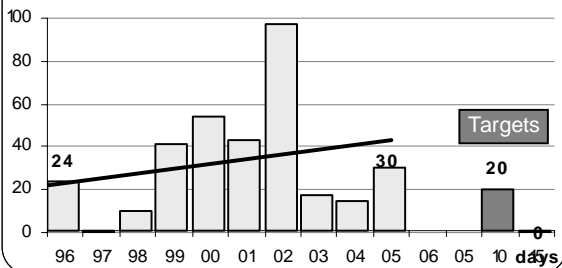

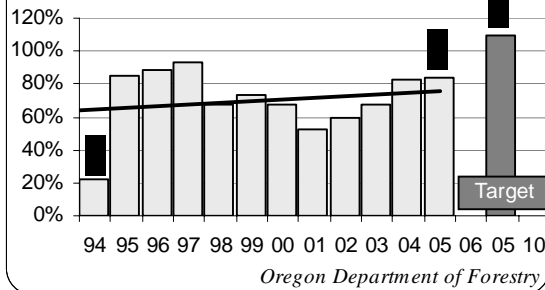

75a. Number of days when air is unhealthy for sensitive groups

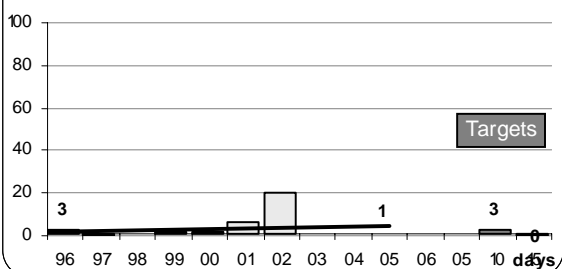


83a. Timber harvest as a percent of planned on public lands

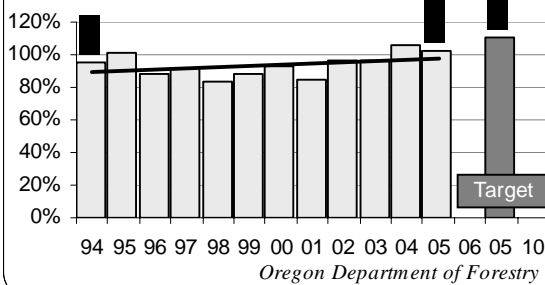

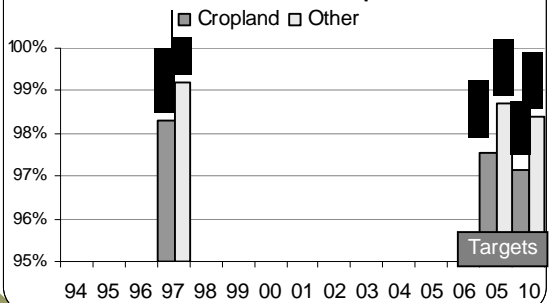
75b. Number of days in cities when air is unhealthy for all groups



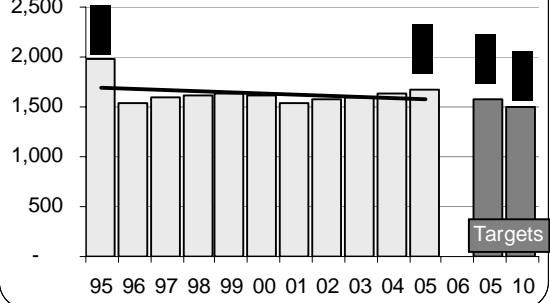
83b. Timber harvest as a percent of projected on private lands

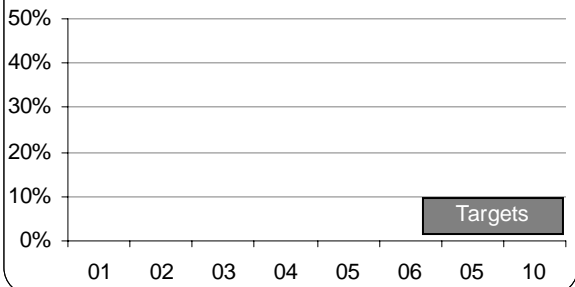

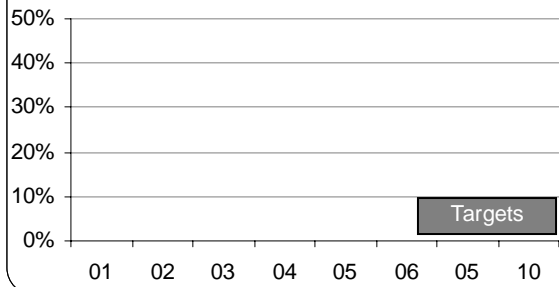

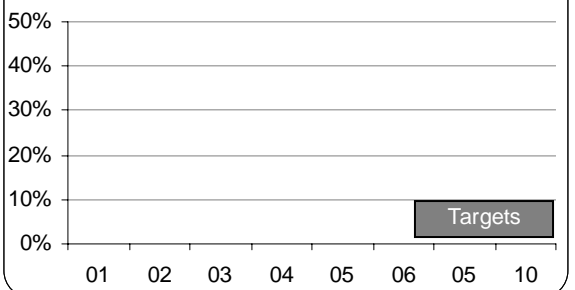
89a. Percent of land in Oregon that is a natural forest



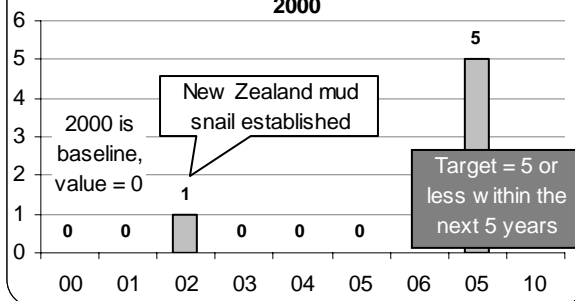
89d. Percent of land in Oregon that is a natural wetland/riparian area



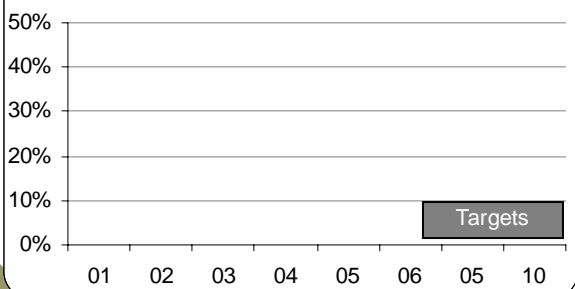
89b. Percent of land in Oregon that is a natural shrubland



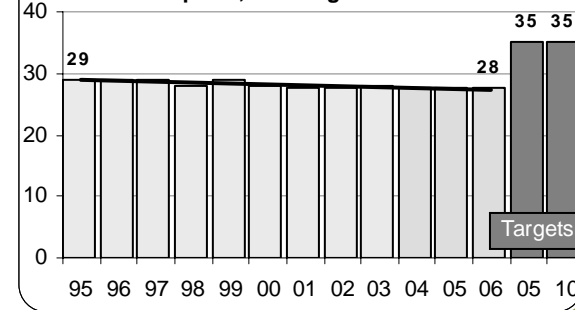
90. Number of invasive species not successfully excluded or contained since 2000

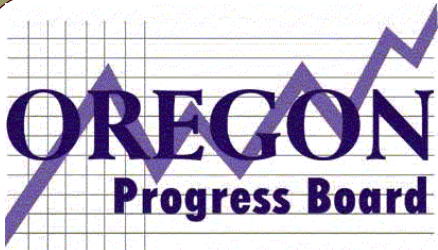
